## More ASK Fr. Joe,

### **Q-When did you receive your calling for the priesthood?**

A-When does anyone receive their calling to anything? I know the answer that you are looking for would be something like January 21<sup>st</sup> 1998ish but I don't think it works like that. I think God was always calling (moreover, I think God is always calling everyone to something), there were times in my life that I wasn't listening or was busy with other things or I simply ignored God. God is still calling me everyday to respond to God's generosity to me. I am humbled and honored to serve God's holy people.

### **Q-How many years have you been a priest?**

A-An Ordained priest? For 23 years. A royal priest since my baptism!

### **Q-Do you like cats?**

A-I do but am very allergic, so I keep my distance...I'm really a dog person.

### **Q-Can you address spousal abuse. The different types, especially the financial ones?**

A-All abuse is sinful. I'm not an expert by any means so I would defer to someone who is an expert on abuse to answer all the various forms that it takes: verbal, physical, mental, emotional, etc. what I can speak to is that disciples ought to live by a set of moral and ethical values. There are certain characteristics of a disciple. Primarily, is how we treat one another with dignity and respect, charity and compassion, kindness and forgiveness. If we embody these characteristics, then we manifest the Christ in the world who also embodied these characteristics. It is our mission to make Christ present through our behavior.

### **Q-Why is there no women disciples?**

A-Actually there were several prominent female disciples. Mary Magdala, Joanna and Susanna are explicitly named. I'm confident there were several others. While they were not names 'Apostles', it was Mary Magdala who was the first to witness the Resurrection and proclaim...she is the first Evangelist, while all the 'apostles' abandoned Jesus.

### **Q-Why can't women be priests? Especially in this day and age and with the shortage?**

A-this is a complicated question...the short answer is it is and always has been the tradition of the Church to have only male ordained clergy. In Jesus' time, the Jewish priesthood was only male; Jesus only selected male people as his apostles and as the priest acts in 'persona Christi', that is, 'in the person of Christ' while dispensing the Sacraments of the Church and because Christ was a male so too must the priest be male.

### **Q-Why do they call Archangels...saints, like ST. Michael?**

A-well, I had to look this up. Here's what I found: As a reward for his loyalty Michael was made the chief angel. Due to this leadership role the Church named the Archangel a Saint, and the Eastern Liturgy assigned him the title of the "Archistrategos" ("highest general"). The cult of St. Michael is very old.

I have about fifty more questions to answer, if I have not answered your question yet I will in the upcoming weeks and months!
